Why must we have the Church?
Isn't God enough?

- A Christ came both to save mankind and to build his Church
- B The process of salvation takes place in the fellowship of the Church
- C The Church is the Body of Christ, the Bride of Christ, and the new Jerusalem.

The Nicene Creed declares:

- 1 *The Church is one*
 - a She has one head, Jesus Christ
 - b Her unity issues from the unity of the Trinity
 - c She is one Body.
- 2 *The Church is holy*
 - A Like Christ the Church has two natures
 - B But only the divine nature of the Church is perfect
 - C The human nature of the Church is imperfect
 - D The Church is called to holiness – to be transformed into the likeness of Christ.

- 3 *The Church is catholic*
- A She holds to the Catholic faith, i.e. to the wholeness of the truth
 - B The Church extends over the whole earth
 - C 'Eastern' Orthodox is now a misnomer: the Church is on all six continents.
- 4 *The Church is apostolic*
- A It follows the teaching of the apostles
 - B It is called to reach out to the whole world.

In addition to the statements of the Nicene Creed we may add these points:

- 5 *The Church is a loving and caring community*
- A Love is central to the work of the Trinity
 - B Love is central to the life of the Church
 - C Love is greater than faith and hope.
- 6 *The Church is 'Orthodox' - but this is only a temporary title*
- 7 *The Head of the Church is Christ*
- 8 *The Church is the gathered people of God*
- 9 *The unifying factors in the Church are:*
- A The bishop as authoritative teacher of the faith
 - B Our entry to the Church through 'one Baptism'
 - C Our participation in the Divine Liturgy.
- 10 *The Church is the 'soul of the world'*
- 11 *The Holy Spirit leads and inspires the Church:*
- A by giving the blessing of Pentecost to all believers
 - B by abiding for ever in the Church
 - C by bestowing the gifts ('the charisms') of the Holy Spirit on the whole Church
 - D by inspiring us to receive the blessings of God so as to work actively for Christ in the Church and in the world.
